
Plan 1: Academic Track: Focus on Coursework and Thesis

1. Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
2. English proficiency (CU-TEP \geq 60, TOEFL \geq 525, IELTS \geq 5.5; valid within 2 years)
3. Approval by Program Administration Committee



Plan 2: Professional Track

1. Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
2. At least 1 year relevant work experience or currently employed in related sectors
3. English proficiency (CU-TEP \geq 60, TOEFL \geq 525, IELTS \geq 5.5; valid within 2 years)
4. Approval by Program Administration Committee



Plan 1: Academic Track

- 36 credits (24 coursework + 12 thesis)
- For future researchers, academics, and policy analysts

Plan 2: Professional Track

- 36 credits (30 coursework + 6 Independent Study)
- For mid-career professionals, government officials, NGO workers, and development practitioners
